When presented with the written word, our minds create images for the words. But in reverse that is when there is an image and no words, we struggle. What does it mean and what is being said are two of the most often asked questions. In this show Alex wants the many viewers to free their thoughts, invent connections, and discover present day myths. None

is wrong as none are correct. They are all part of a memory to be shared. Imagine finding in an old suitcase, a collection of drawings and paintings, there are angels, three wheelers, forms that are based on betel cutters, jungle and ruins. All familiar, but no words beyond enigmatic titles, you are left to decipher the image for yourselves. These new paintings also reflect something of Alex's deepening recollections of travelling in Sri Lanka over the last 15 years - watching the street life, reading the papers, listening to the stories and experiences of those around him. Alex will surely take these memories home to the UK, and over time images built until they appear on the paper. 

Circa 1962: The city of Calcutta, a young girl Lolita (Vidya Balan), orphaned at an early age is sent to live with her Uncle's family, where destiny introduces her to a young boy Shekhar (Saif Ali Khan). Shekhar a budding musician is the son of an affluent businessman.
