

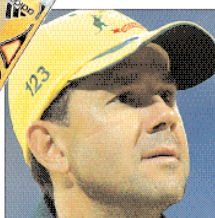

Sachin Ramesh Tendulkar is an Indian cricketer widely regarded as one of the greatest batsmen in the history of cricket. He is the leading run-scorer and century maker in Test & One Day international cricket. He is the only player to score a double century in the history of ODI cricket.

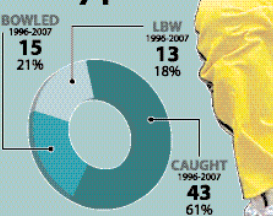

MOST WICKETS

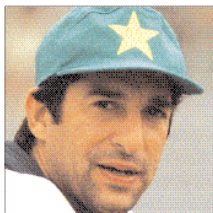

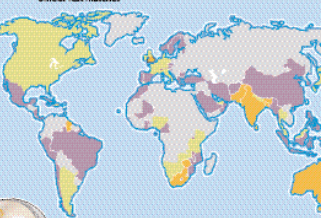

INTERNATIONAL CRICKET COUNCIL (ICC)

The International Cricket Council (ICC) is the international governing body of cricket. It was founded as the Imperial Cricket Conference in 1909 by representatives from England, Australia and South Africa, renamed the International Cricket Conference in 1965, and took up its current name in 1989. The ICC is responsible for the organisation and governance of cricket's major international tournaments, most notably the Cricket World Cup. It also appoints the umpires and referees that officiate at all sanctioned Test matches, One Day International and Twenty20 Internationals.

CRICKET BALL
In test cricket the ball must weigh between 5.5 and 5.75 ounces (155.9 and 163 g) and measure between 8 13/16 and 9 in (22.4 and 22.9 cm) in circumference. Four-piece construction with quilt centre, cork core, cork and worsted yarn layers, leather skin.

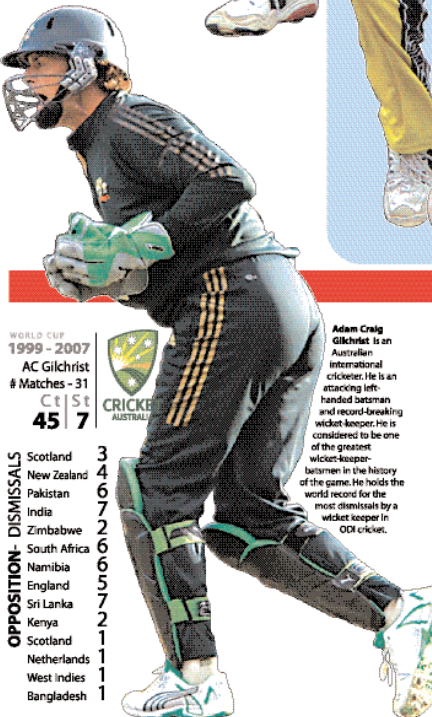

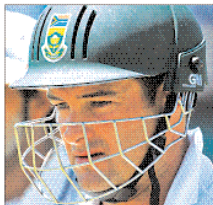

Adam Craig Gilchrist is an Australian international cricketer. He is an attacking left-handed batsman and record-breaking wicket-keeper. He is considered to be one of the greatest wicket-keeper-batsmen in the history of the game. He holds the world record for the most dismissals by a wicket keeper in ODI cricket.



Kumar Chohananda Sangakkara is a Sri Lankan cricketer and captain of the Sri Lanka national cricket team. He used to play as a wicket-keeper and top-order batsman in all forms of the game, but has stopped doing so in Tests as his batting average is significantly higher in Tests when he plays as a pure batsman.
