
# > Alliance Young Artists 2011

American Centre will screen movies on the theme of social issues this month.


Imitation of Life



Imitation of Life (1959) will be screened on October 4 at 6pm at the American Centre, No 44, Galle Road, Colombo 3. (Running Time: 125 minutes)

Douglas Sirk's controversial classic about race relations between women in 1950s America was one of the most commercially successful socially-conscious films of the civil rights era and remains a fascinating window into a time period that continues to resonate. Lana Turner and Sandra Dee get top billing, but the film's center is the indelible Juanita Moore, an African-American servant who cares for her white boss's daughter as she struggles to raise her own. Unabashedly soapy, the film dazzles as it unsettles on its way to a heartbreaking finale. Gospel legend Mahalia Jackson makes a guest appearance.

## L'Enfant (The Child)

The movie, L'Enfant (The Child) 2005 (1h30) will be screened on October 22 at 3.30 pm at Alliance Française de Kandy, 642, Perad eniya Road, Kandy.

Bruno, 20, and Sonia, 18, are surviving on her welfare checks and Bruno's petty crimes when Sonia becomes pregnant. Bruno sells

their baby to a black market adoption ring to make some quick cash. Faced with Sonia's shock, he regrets his mistake and buys the child back at a premium - but, after being turned away by Sonia, his mounting debts and desperation lead Bruno down a quick path to prison. L'Enfant succeeds not because it illuminates anything about a black market for children (the characters motivations are entirely personal, not social), but in the way a finely detailed character study pays off in its final redemptive moments.
