


Sixth Galle Literary Festival this week

Miniature Abstract Paintings III at AF Kandy



To art lovers in particular and to others in general, Palliyaguruge is a person who is unequivocally devoted to the aesthetics, needs no introduction. He is a highly talented artist cum architectural designer well known for his works of art in Sri Lanka as well as abroad by having his solo exhibitions of art at the Headquarters of the Association in Main State Society Washington USA in 1984 and being privileged to be selected to present his work of art at the International Union for the conservation of Nature Poster competition in Athens (Greece) as way back in 1958.

His excellent career as an artist has its roots at his alma mater Mahinda College Galle in early 1950's. Bagging the first prize in art competitions he took part had been the norm, which culminated in having presented with a streak of awards including the covetous state honours Kalabooshana from the Ministry of Cultural affairs and as well as Kandurata Suriya Sammana State award for Art & Samp; Craft from the Ministry of Central Province Development.

It is no exaggeration to pronounce that everyone who has the opportunity to visit this exhibition of superb art work will undoubtedly relish it.


