
Mathu Davasa to be launched

(Running Time: 112 minutes) Martin Scorsese's breakthrough film is the story of a young Italian-American man torn between the life of spirituality that he craves and the realities of the streets of New York. This small but astonishing film is anchored by career-making performances from Harvey Keitel and Robert DeNiro. Keitel struggles to find a balance between his life in organized crime—a life



that he cannot escape fromand his devout religious upbringing; DeNiro's Johnny Boy is a small-time gangster who seems to not understand the difference between his real life of crime and a romanticized notion of the mob that he's learned from mov-

But the real star is Scorsese, who demonstrates for the first time the sheer talent that he would later elevate to his legendary virtuosity. Great sound-

Matko is a small time hustler, living by the Danube with his 17 year old son Zare. After a failed business

deal he owes money to the much more successgangster Dadan. Dadan has a sister, Afrodita, that he desperately wants to see get married so they strike a deal: Zare is to marry her. But none of the two care much for an arranged marriage: Zare is in love with Ida, Afrodita is waiting for the man of her dreams.

The Lady

The Lady (2011) by Luc Besson will be screened on May 29 at 3 pm and 5.30 pm at the International Centre for Ethnic Studies (ICES) auditorium, 02, Kynsey Terrace, Colombo 8. (Running Time: 122 minutes)

The timing is perfect for a film biography of Aung San Suu Kyi, the Burmese activist and recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize in 1991 and her British husband Michael Aris. It is an epic tale of the peaceful quest of The Lady, a name bestowed upon her by the Burmese people who see the heroine as a beacon of grace and courage. Directed by renowned filmmaker Luc Bensson.

The Lady is a story of devotion and human understanding set against a backdrop of political turmoil that continues today. The film was written over a period of three years by Rebecca Frayn. The Lady features an unforgettable and powerful performance by Michelle Yeoh (Crouching Tiger, Hidden Dragon; Memoirs of a G.eisha) in the title role.
