


Soul Cages at Bishop's College Auditorium

COCO avant Chanel

The movie, COCO avant Chanel (2009) by Anne Fontaine will be screened on Tuesday, June 26 at 3pm and Wednesday, June 27 at 6.30pm at Alliance Française de Colombo, 11, Barnes Place, Colombo 7.

Several years after leaving the orphanage to which her father never returned for her, Gabrielle Chanel finds herself working in a provincial bar both. She's both a seamstress for the performers and a singer, earning the nickname Coco from the song she sings nightly with her sister. A liaison with Baron Balsan gives her an entree into French society and a chance to develop her gift for designing increasingly popular hats. When she falls in love with English businessman Arthur Capel further opportunities open up, though life becomes ever more complicated.

The movie is for general viewing and is subtitled in English.

Four Days in September (Brazil)

Four Days in September (1997) by Bruno Barreto will be screened on June 29 at 6 pm at 3 and 5.30 pm at International Centre for Ethnic Studies (ICES) auditorium, No. 2.Kvnsev Terrace, Colombo 8. (Running Time: 1hour and

46minutes) The democratically elected government of Brazil was toppled and a military dictatorship took place. The junta ruled through terror and intimidation, torturing political enemies, controlling the press, and severely curtailing freedoms. A group of Che Guevara-worshipping Marxist radicals plotted to kidnap an American ambassador (Alan Arkin) to force the government to meet their demands. This is a thoughtful political drama with emotional depth, well-drawn characters, and excellent direction. Based on a memoir of one of the participants in the kidnap of the American Ambassador in Brazil in 1969. The film was honored with an Academy Award nomination.



Whole Train

Whole Train (2006) directed by Florian Gaag will be screened on June 27 at the Goethe hall, No39, Gregory's Road, Colombo 7 at 5.30 pm.

Florian Gaag tells the story of a crew of four 'writers' David, Tino, Elyas und Achim - who observe the hierarchies, the values, the rules and the codes of the graffiti scene. Night after night they make off for the subway stations of the city, intent on leaving opulent images behind. But as another crew appears on the scene and the four feel challenged, a creative battle ensues, one that will change the lives of these young people for ever.

We are confronted with life taken to the limit. Constantly on the edge of legality. Always on the run from the law. Urban space must be reclaimed. Friends are made and

lost. Unbridled creativity and doing things for the sheer love of it are watchwords too. Whole Train is an axciting and emotionally gripping drama, one that explores for the first time the secret universe of the graffiti scene.
