African countries represented Halls 20 and 21, among them were South Sudan, who gained independence from Sudan in 2011 and was a newcomer to ITB Berlin 2013. Arab countries such as Egypt, Jordan, Israel, Morocco, Tunisia and the United Arab Emirates had also booked their places at the world's largest travel trade show.
