The Annual Relay Carnival conducted by the Athletics association of Sri Lanka (AASL) and sponsored by Bank of Ceylon was held at the Diyagama Mahinada Rajapaksa Stadium which was a great success. Bank of Ceylon Deputy General Manager (Corporate and Offshore Banking) D P K Gunasekera was the chief guest at the event.

Two new national records and six new meet records were bettered at this year's carnival. Army SC won the overall inter-club men's championship with 47 points while Navy with 43 points was placed second. Air Force collected 29 points to win the third place. Army SC athletes established both national records that were set in the event by clocking 15:52.99secs in the 4x1500m men's relay and 7:33.13secs in the men's 4x800m relay events.

In the women's category Air Force collected 50 points to win the inter-club overall championship beating Army who claimed 41 points and Navy with 30 points to second and third places respectively.

Maris Stella College Negombo won the schools overall boys' championship with 85 points while overall girls' segment of the schools championship was won by Ratnayake Central Walala who finished with a staggering of 111 points.
