oly Family Convent (HFC) Kurunegala emerged overall champions for the sixth consecutive year at the 22nd Milo All Island Schools Netball Championship concluded at the Piliyandala Central College ground in Piliyandala yesterday.

The lasses from Kurunegala bagged their first championship in 2008 when it was held at Kurunegala and continued the same momentum in 2009 (Anuradhapura), 2010



(Matale), 2011 (Matara) and 2012 (Polonnaruwa) championships.

It was a superlative performance by the Kurunegala girls who despite having no sponsors and a proper venue for them to practice.

The experienced defending champions went down fighting in the 'A' category to bag under 14 and under 16 and were able to secure the third place in the under 18 which helped Familians to bag the title for the sixth successive year.

HFC overall netball champs


They justified their qualification when they repeated their last year's performances. The girls from Kalutara Balika Vidyalaya shattered the high hopes of Musaeus
